#### VOICE OF ALBERTA POLL SURVEY METHODOLOGY

- Study fielded via online research panel, July 30 -August 6, 2012. Panel Source: Voice of Alberta.
- on=1090
- Weighted to reflect gender, age, region of Alberta population
- Sample of 1090, margin of error which measures sampling variability - is +/- 3.0%
- Margin of error larger & varies for smaller subsamples


#### POLITICAL LANDSCAPE SUMMER 2012 WELCOME TO "ALISON'S WORLD"

  - Budget issues, expenses scandal, pipeline showdowns...
















## PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE






## TRACKING PROVINCIAL GOVERNMENT PERFORMANCE

#### NORTHERN GATEWAY: SCIENCE NOT POLITICS?

- PM says "science not politics" will decide Northern Gateway's fate
- Is that a directive or desire?
  - Focus on "science" likely only way to move NG forward
  - Politics of the situation heavily stacked against the project
  - Strong opposition in B.C., with both provincial and federal implications
  - Opposition to royalty sharing in AB
  - Public/political goodwill toward Enbridge lacking given recent events in other jurisdictions
    - Public case will be Enbridge's to make with little support from political circles





### B.C.MIGHT SUPPORT GATEWAY WITH THE RIGHT INCENTIVES?

- Nearly 6-in-10 BC residents oppose Northern Gateway
- Trailing in the polls & May 2013 election looming...
- Outlines necessary conditions for B.C. Gov't support
  - Environmental equivalent of "Distinct Society"
  - Most contentious condition is a "fair share of fiscal & economic benefits"
  - Vague definition, but clear implication: Alberta & Feds must negotiate a "better deal" for BC or Northern Gateway won't happen
- Clark fails to get an up-tick from Gateway conditions





### ALBERTANS SUPPORT NORTHERN GATEWAY BUT NOT SHARING ROYALTIES

- Redford defends Alberta's oil royalties although Clark's vague language meant they were never really under attack
- Albertan's strongly support Redford's stand
  - Nearly 70% approve of Premier's rebuff of B.C. demands
  - Albertans sympathetic to B.C.'s argument, but believe its up to the pipeline proponent (Enbridge), not the Alberta government, to make B.C. supportive
- If forced to choose, majority of Albertans would rather see Northern Gateway fail, than to see Alberta give up any oil royalties





#### WILL THE FEDS STEP IN TO SAVE NORTHERN GATEWAY?

- NEB Panel assessment on Gateway now due December 31, 2013; next federal election October 2015
- Politics suggest Conservatives reluctant to intervene directly
  - Cabinet members starting to soften supportive language
  - Conservatives hold 8 seat majority in current Commons - 21 out of 36 seats in BC
  - BC seats growing in next election to 42
- Gateway is a deeply divisive issue in BC
  - Direct intervention to push Gateway would likely not only cost them some current seats, but also future new seats (and potentially Government)



"And how familiar would you say you are with the Northern Gateway Pipeline project? Are you...?"






### PUBLIC SUPPORT FOR NORTHERN GATEWAY PIPELINE

"The Northern Gateway is a pipeline being proposed for construction by Enbridge. It will be 1,177 km long and run between Edmonton and Kitimat, B.C. It would carry oilsands bitumen to the B.C. coast for transport and refining in Asia. Enbridge's application for the pipeline is currently being reviewed by a federal panel called the National Energy Board."



"When it comes to Alberta's future economic prosperity, how important do you think the Northern Gateway Pipeline is for the economy?"




"And based upon your impressions today, how likely do you think it is that the Northern Gateway Pipeline **will actually be built** in the next few years?"






### ALBERTANS REACT TO B.C. PREMIER'S POSITION ON GATEWAY

"B.C. Premier Christy Clark recently said that as it stands today, she feels that British Columbia would not receive enough economic benefit from the Northern Gateway Pipeline in comparison to the environmental risk it poses. Therefore she says the Federal and Alberta governments need to negotiate a better financial deal with British Columbia if the pipeline is to go ahead."




## ALBERTANS REACT TO B.C. PREMIER'S POSITION ON GATEWAY - TALKING POINT VERSION -

"B.C. Premier Christy Clark said that environmentally British Columbia would be accepting 100% of the marine risk and 58% of the land risk associated with a pipeline spill, but is only going to be receiving 8% of the tax revenue generated by the Northern Gateway Pipeline. Knowing this, would you say you agree or disagree with the position that the Federal and Alberta governments need to negotiate a better financial deal with British Columbia if the pipeline is to go ahead?"






### ALBERTANS REACT TO PREMIER REDFORD'S REBUFF OF B.C. ON GATEWAY

"In response to B.C.'s call for more economic benefits from the Northern Gateway Pipeline, Alberta Premier Alison Redford said that she would be happy to sit down to talk with the B.C. Premier, but Alberta is not prepared to share oil royalties with B.C."

Do not give up a portion of Alberta's oil royalties to the gov't of BC knowing their opposition may reduce the likelihood that Northern Gateway will proceed













"If a provincial election were held tomorrow in British Columbia, which one of the following parties would you be most likely to support in your constituency?"






#### POLITICAL HORSERACE IN BC

"If a provincial election were held tomorrow in British Columbia, which one of the following parties would you be most likely to support in your constituency?"







"If a provincial election were held tomorrow in British Columbia, which one of the following parties would you be most likely to support in your constituency?"







#### BC VOTERS EVALUATE PARTY LEADERS (AUGUST 2012)


"Do you approve or disapprove of the performance of each of the following people?"
