## **RESEARCH METHODOLOGY**

Study fielded via online research panel

- Field Dates: November 7 13, 2013
- Panel Source: Voice of Alberta
- Weighted to reflect gender, age, region of Alberta population according to Stats Canada
- Sample of 1210, margin of error, which measures sampling variability, is +/- 2.8%
- Margin of error larger & varies for subsamples


