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RESEARCH METHODOLOGY

- Study fielded via online research panel
 - Field Dates: October 6 9, 2014
 - Panel Source: Voice of Alberta & Vision Critical
- $^{\circ}$ n=1419
- Weighted to reflect gender, age, region of Alberta population according to Stats Canada
- For sample of 1419, margin of error, which measures sampling variability, is +/- 2.6% (Note: Non-probability sample; results considered accurate within +/- 2.6% based on probability sample of this size at a 95% confidence interval)
- Margin of error larger & varies for subsamples






