RESEARCH METHODOLOGY



- Study fielded via online research panel
 - Field dates: May 15 to 21, 2017
 - Panel source: Voice of Alberta & Angus Reid Forum
- n=1195
- Weighted to reflect gender, age and region of Alberta population according to Stats Canada
- This online survey utilizes a representative but non-random sample, therefore margin of error is not applicable. However, a probability sample of this size would yield a margin of error of +/- 2.8 percentage points at a 95% confidence interval.
- Accuracy of sub-samples of the data decline based on sample sizes

-INTRODUCTION



Gay-Straight (GSAs) are student-run, teacher-supported peer support groups in Alberta Schools. The intent of these groups is to reduce marginalization of LGBTQ youth by creating a safe, inclusionary space for them and their friends. GSAs give students a confidential and non-judgmental place to discuss their feelings and experiences related to sexual orientation, gender identity, gender expression and other interests.

In Alberta, GSAs have also been a contentious public issue, and a political football which a succession of PC leaders have fumbled.

Our May survey asked Albertans their take on these important student organizations.

-KEY FINDINGS




- Albertans support GSAs, with significant intensity. Almost two-thirds (65%) of Albertans favour the current policy for GSAs in schools, with 42% offering strong approval, compared to only 26% who disapprove
 - Support strongest is in urban areas, increases with education, declines with age, and is higher among women and those with young families
- When it comes to balancing rights related to GSAs, the public tilts in favour of students. Over one-half (56%) feel it should be up to students when/if they tell their parents about joining a GSA, while 31% say parents should be notified if their kids join a GSA. Only 5% feel it should be left up to individual school boards, administrators or teachers



% Strongly/Somewhat Approve




PUBLIC VIEWS ON PARENT NOTIFICATION RE: GSAS
